



Young Horse Show Series - List of Classes:

In Hand & At Liberty - Horses ages 1-4yrs - (All disciplines) - \$65/class (includes handler fees)

Class# 101 - Yearling

Class# 102 - 2yr olds

Class# 103 - 3yr olds

Class# 104 - 4yr olds

Blue Chip Farm Jump Chute - Horses ages 2-4yrs - (All disciplines) - \$65/class (includes handler fees)

Class#210 - Schooling/warm-up Jump Chute - \$45 (includes handlers fee, not judged)

Flat Classes for Sport Under Saddle - Horses age 3-5yrs - (All disciplines) - \$35/class

Jumping Under Saddle & YJC Development - Horses age 4-5yr olds - (Hunter / Jumper) - \$35/class

In order for a horse to be in the YJC Development Program requires:

YJC Nominating Fee \$50/horse/yr

Also add \$10 to the Jumping Class fee making them a total of \$45/class

YHS General Rules and Regulations:

IMPORTANT NOTES FOR ALL CLASSES AND PARTICIPANTS

If the rider falls off or dismounts the horse for any reasons without being asked specifically by the judge, the horse and rider will be excused from the ring.

If the judge feels that the rider/horse or handler/horse combination is unsafe for anyone involved or if the horse looks irregular in his gates, the judge will excuse the said combination from the class.

All persons entering any Young Horse Show venues must be wearing adequate footwear (closed toe shoes).

Class Fees:

- Classes 100, 200 \$65 (includes handler)
- Classes 100 and 200 \$65 (include handlers fee)
- Class 210 \$45 (includes handlers fees)
- Classes 300, 400, 500 \$35
- YJC nomination fee \$50/Horse/Year (see YJC web site)
- YJC Development Program an additional \$10/horse if your horse already competes in classes 404 or 405 (same course, same heights).

Show Fees:

- All stalls are bare Make sure to bring: Bedding, Hay and Water buckets.
- Grounds Fee: \$50 per horse
- Office / Administration fee: \$35 per horse
- Stall Fee: \$75
- Trailer in Fee: \$15
- A late fee of \$20 will apply to all participants entering past the closing date.

Scores: Each horse will receive a Final Score per class entered that will be based on a scale from 1 to 10 or a % for dressage tests.

Professional Handlers: Due to liability issues, professional handlers are mandatory for the in-hand and jump chute divisions. We have arranged for a minimum of two professional handlers to be present at the show. Their fees are included in the class.

Bridles: Mandatory for 2 year olds and older. Optional for yearlings. Make sure to have reins with clips that are easy to remove.

Stalls: Mandatory for 1, 2 and 3 years old and/or if participating in classes 100s or 200s.

Stalls will be available from Thursday June 6th noon until Friday night May 7th after the show. Please note another show will be moving in so we will need stalls available immediately following the YHS. We will have volunteers available to help assist you with loading equipment. Thank you for respecting these time constraints.

Trailer in: Horses competing in classes 300s, 400s and 500s ONLY, can be trailered in (do not have to purchase a stall).

Horses will have to be attended at all times. No trailer tying.

Ribbons will be awarded to the first to third placing in each class.

Equine Health Information

The state of MA requires that all horses entering the state provide a negative Coggins test within one year of entry signed by a licensed veterinarian within 30 days of entry. Horses originating within the state of MA are required to have a negative Coggins within one year and a current Health Certificate.

The negative Coggins must accompany all entries for the show. The paperwork will be checked. Thank you for your cooperation.

Bedding and Stabling

Stalls will be available for horses participating in the event.

Please clean your stalls upon departure.

All stall reservations must be made with entries.

Stalls will be available for Thursday June 7th Noon until Friday after the show (unless you compete in the breed show).

Veterinary Services

A veterinarian will be on call or in attendance for all horse show events and available for 24 hour a day emergencies and any health care needs.

Headgear

All riders must wear APPROVED protective headgear while mounted.

Dogs

No dogs are permitted on the premises unless kept on a leash at all times.

Damage

All owners and exhibitors shall be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their agents, or employees to stalls, buildings, or other properties on the show grounds, and shall be billed accordingly.

It is the intention of this Young Horse Show to provide our young horses a suitable environment to begin their careers without the pressures of the Show Circuit. With this in mind, we kindly request that owners, trainers and riders abide by a drug-free show for the young horses. The judges are tolerant of and expect "young horse mistakes." So, Let's "just say No" and enjoy our horses' first steps towards a competitive career!

HORSE SHOW TIPS

MAKE THE MOST OF YOUR SHOW BY FOLLOWING THESE TIPS!

Take pictures! Take video!

Here are a few tips to help:

- Make sure your horse is clean and braided. If you cannot have your horse braided, make sure the mane is pulled and short.
- For the in hand classes, make sure to have reins with clips that are easy to remove
- If your horse is not used to a bridle, we recommend that you practice at home a few times before the show
- Make sure your horse's feet are trimmed and clean. The trimming should be done a few days before the show to avoid soreness in the feet.
- For the in hand classes, make sure to have reins with clips that are easy to remove.
- If your horse is not accustomed to a bridle, we recommend that you practice at home a few times before the show.
- Please be mindful of your space when you have a horse in hand. Try not to get yourself crowded with other horses around.
- Practice the jump chute at home if possible. Do not over face your horse!
 The height is not important at first. You just need to build confidence.
